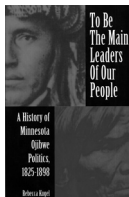

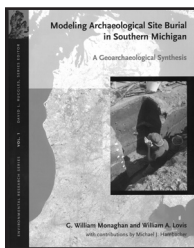


**To Be the Main Leaders of Our People

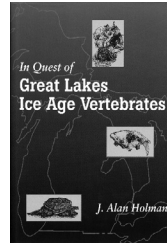
